Guidance (Max 250 words)	 Some people with partial onset seizures in epilepsy do not achieve an adequate clinical response with currently available treatments.
	• Retigabine has a novel mode of action and is now recommended as an adjunctive treatment in people whose epilepsy is resistant to current therapies.
	 Patients may require an ECG prior to starting treatment to monitor the risk of QT prolongation and cardiac events.
