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Meet Your LabMed North West Regional Tutor

Ed Hinchliffe, Manchester University NHS Trust

Within the last year I took over the role of the LabMed Regional Tutor for the North West region. I'd like to begin by saying a huge thank you to Anna Milan, the previous holder of this post. This brief article is to highlight the role of the Regional Tutor and the support that myself, and the wider North West LabMed Committee, can provide to trainees and their supervisors.

Following centralisation of STP recruitment with the National School of Healthcare Sciences, the scope and remit of the Regional Tutor has changed significantly within the last decade. Nevertheless, as a Training Officer within my Trust and alumni of the HSST programme myself, I believe there is still much support that can be offered to STP, HSST and medical trainees within our profession.

The principal role of the Regional Tutor is to promote, coordinate and monitor professional training within our region, with an aim of providing training support that is otherwise difficult to obtain from their employer and/or national structured formal training programme. This is as a service to LabMed members, hence those reaching out for support are encouraged to consider LabMed membership.

Some of the pertinent responsibilities of the Regional Tutor include:

- To provide an oversight of training, and advice for LabMed members who are pre-registration trainees and their supervisors.
- To liaise with the training providers on behalf of trainees in the region.
- To provide support and advice for members who are trainees and supervisors in the region preparing for FRCPath examinations.
- To provide support and signposting for those going through a registration equivalence process.
- To provide support and signposting to students interested in a career as a clinical scientist. Promote STEM ambassadors and involvement in public engagement events/careers talks.
- To attend the two national Biochemistry Education Group meetings per year, providing a report for the region, and liaise with other regional tutors and the Education & Training Committee with regards training, educational activities and courses.
